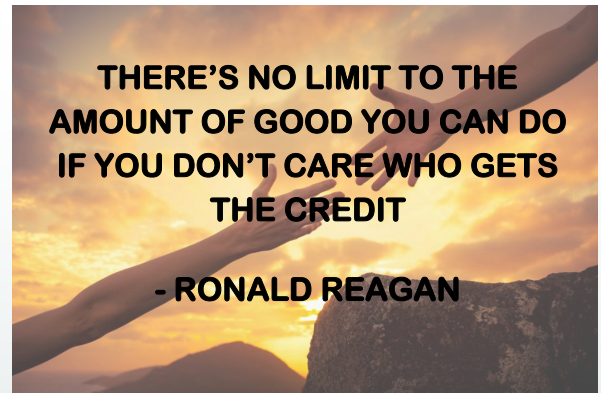
MEMORIAL DAY BOWS

Starting this
summer 2021,
the Village of
Sherman will
be completing the
final phase of the



Drinking Water Improvement Project. This project will include major renovation of the water pumps and buildings that supply the reservoir from the lower aquifer, the installation of water mains on Route 76 (Kipp, Franklin, Osborne), direct drilling, connecting water lines on West Main Street, and in some areas (Kipp) there will be much needed new sidewalks installed.

In March the Village was awarded the NY Main Street - Technical Assistance grant in the amount of \$20,000 from the NY Office of Community Renewal. This award will help prepare building condition surveys and help Main Street businesses seek rehabilitation as well as improvement grant opportunities.

Earlier this year the Village of Sherman said goodbye to a longtime member, Mr. Russell Babcock who served the Village for over 30 years. As the clerk-treasurer he was instrumental in much of what supported the village residents and businesses from 1963 to 1993 including the construction of the Wastewater Treatment Plant of 1979.
